WHO IS JESUS?



The Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches that 'everything in the life of Jesus is a sign of his mystery.' It goes on to say, 'His deeds, miracles, and words all revealed that "in him the whole fullness of deity dwells bodily."' (Col 2:9; CCC 515)

The Gospels were written 'so that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that believing you may have life in his name.' (Jn 30:21)

Jesus did not teach much about the moral law. He wanted us to know him, to know who he really is. To keep this in mind helps us to read the Gospels with understanding.

For example, in the story of the ten lepers, read today at Mass, what are we taught by the difference between the nine who went off to show themselves to the priests, and the one who returned to thank Jesus?

The nine all went off to show themselves to the priests, as Jesus ordered. This was the usual thing for a Jew to do. The priests were authorised to declare a person clean of leprosy. The nine were following the law, the old law. We never hear from them again.

The other one was a Samaritan. He was not going to have anything to do with the Jewish priests, whom he would have regarded as 'heretics'. But he did find himself cured, so he showed himself to Jesus, and thanked him. He was the only one who recognised that Jesus was the one who had cured him. He had found the power of the new law. We don't know what happened to him after that, but it would not be surprising to find that he became one of the crowd who followed Jesus.

How will we know Jesus better? Through contemplating the mysteries revealed in the stories of the New Testament. A good way of doing so is in the praying of the Rosary. And remember, to pray the Rosary without meditating on the mysteries is not praying the Rosary at all.

Sadly, Father Anthony Van Dyke, OP, died on Wednesday night. No funeral arrangements yet.

Fr Karl has gone to Brisbane already. The move was always seen as tentative, but happened quickly in the end. He will be in supported accommodation there for as long as necessary.

I am at a conference about RCIA at The Monastery this weekend, so will not be here for the morning Masses. But I will be here for the Rosary on Sunday afternoon. You be there too!

I am cross that Broken Bay (North Shore of Sydney) has a bishop now, and we still don't!

September 1st 2019

All volunteers aged 14 years and over are required to have a Police Check. Persons aged over 80 years are no longer exempted. If these changes apply to you, please fill in an application form (available in the Sacristy) and then get Fr Paul, Mary Mathew or Siobhan Rowe to do your 100pt ID check. Your applications will then be forwarded to the Screening and Verification Authority (SAVA) for processing. The follow up process is usually completed online. If this creates a difficulty for you please let Mary Mathew or Siobhan Rowe in the Parish Office know and we will assist you.
