Who's a Good Samaritan now then?

The Good Samaritan in the gospel story today is someone who was not expected to take any notice of the man who had been bashed and robbed. They were foreigners and enemies. The ones who might have been expected to take action, the priest and Levite, placed more importance on their ritual duties than on compassion for the needy.

It's easy to say 'someone else will look after her', or 'typical drunken beggar'.

Yet there are plenty of opportunities for any of us to take up the role of Good Samaritan, and many ways of responding to the needs of the disadvantaged, whether we think they deserve it or not. And is it up to us to judge that?

Some of these ways are ordinary and well within the possibility of most of us. Let's not 'pass by on the other side'.

I would like to say that you are most generous with your giving to special collections. For the record, the collection for the works of Pope Francis, on the weekend of 29/30 June, amounted to \$1151.60. I know that the Good Friday collection for the shrines and people of the Holy Land amounted to \$1832.85; and the most outstanding of all: the St Vincent de Paul Society Winter Appeal was supported with no less than \$4600!



Now this weekend you are being asked to buy a cake to support not only the parish, but a project that is special to me: the De La Salle College in Bomana, Papua New Guinea. The community of De La Salle brothers is served by the Dominican community. The college has been run down because maintenance has been neglected. What is more, the students are mostly from the slums, or 'settlements'; shanty housing, often no water or electricity. Some are in the photo. They include older students returning to school to upgrade their

qualifications for employment – which is very hard to get. They are often in classes of 60. The government has a 'fee-free' policy – but with inadequate funding support – which means that the college has to raise funds from some people who can only afford to live by begging - or stealing.

When I told the DLS Brothers I was leaving for Australia, I thought it was good to offer them at least a token of support from the people of Australia. So please buy a cake and support not only our parish but the DLS College in PNG too. You can be a Good Samaritan today.

Is God the most important person in your life? Talk to Him everyday and you will grow to love Him. You can be a good neighbour to everyone by being a good friend of God.

Dominican General Chapter. The Dominican friars are currently holding a General Chapter in Vietnam. This is a meeting of delegates from the whole Order. Delegates of the Province of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary in Australia and New Zealand are Fr Anthony Walsh, the Prior Provincial, Fr Peter Hoang from Doubleview, Perth, and Fr Stephen Kerry from the Solomon Islands. The work of the chapter includes electing a new Master of the Order, the general superior to succeed Fr Bruno Cadore.

Br William OP has left for Melbourne where he will take an examination in preparation for his ordination to the priesthood. The ordination will take place at St Mary's Cathedral, Sydney, at the hands of Archbishop Anthony Fisher OP, on Saturday 3 August – the day that Australia and New Zealand celebrate St Dominic.

Br Brendan is back to his usual self.

Fr Ben has been moved to Calvary Rehabilitation, but we don't expect that he will be there for long.

Fr Karl continues to make slow progress at Hampstead Rehab. Planning has been begun for his care following rehabilitation.

The Australian Bishops have all visited Rome recently for their regular *ad liminia* visit. There is a summary report of their visit from Bishop O'Kelly on the churches notice boards. The bishops met the Pope and the Vatican departments. They reported that under Pope Francis the staff of the departments take more care to listen to what the bishops have to say.

Caritas Australia, the Catholic agency for international aid and development asks our support for a petition to the Australian Government asking them to: Rule out fossil fuel investments and prioritise renewable energy; and direct government operations to utilize 100% renewable energy. Forms are at the doors of the churches. More information will be given in future editions of the Dominews.

Child Safe Environments Briefing for Volunteers

Tuesday, July 16, 2019 at 6:30 pm in the Parish Hall

As you may be aware, all volunteers in our Archdiocese are mandated notifiers under the South Australian Child Protection Legislation. To ensure we hear the voices of children and have the necessary skills to identify and respond appropriately, we invite any volunteers who have not yet participated in Child Safe Environments training or an equivalent course to attend a 90 minute Volunteer Briefing session facilitated by the Archdiocesan Child Protection Unit. Please note that these briefings (or an equivalent course) are a compulsory requirement for anyone wishing to be a Eucharistic Minister. A Volunteer Briefing will be held in our Parish on:

Note: If you have attended a Child Safe Environments or RAN training within the past 3 years you do not need to attend a Volunteer Briefing

Planned Giving
