"Do this in memory of me"



These are the words Jesus said as he gave his disciples the bread and wine which he declared to be his Body and Blood, as recorded in the gospel according to Luke. The same words are echoed by the celebrant at Mass following the consecration of the bread and wine.

It is not simply for the sake of imitation or play-acting that the celebrant uses these words. We do so because Jesus enters space and time to be with us here and now, as he was with his disciples on that night. This is the nature of

mystery in the Catholic faith. Actions and words have supernatural meaning. We are present with him at the Last Supper, and at Calvary and on the road to Emmaus.

We can expect that Jesus will give us the same gift, dread and encouragement as he gave the disciples at these events. He not only gave his life for us, he gives his life *to* us.

How will we live it? Only with faith, which means that everything is different while everything is the same. By faith we perceive that the ordinary has become supernatural.

Does the Eucharist make you or me any different? Again, it does when we have faith in it. Will we act differently? Will we choose to love as Jesus loved us – whether we feel like it or not?

Remember the Eucharist is food. Food makes us grow – gradually, inexorably. Our spiritual selves are real, as our material bodies are. We grow spiritually in a similar way that our bodies do – if we allow it, by exercising our faith, by breathing the spiritual air of faith and good works for the sake of Jesus.

There is something I want to ask you to do. It is not "a matter of life and death" but it does mean something:

When you are given Holy Communion, you will hear the minister say 'the Body of Christ', or 'the Blood of Christ'. I would like the minister to be able to hear you say 'Amen' in response. This affirms your faith in the reality of the Eucharist. It is the expected response, as you can read in your missals and Mass books. I can't and don't judge people badly for not doing so, but it does disappoint me when I don't hear this act of faith. If the recipient is not known to me, it gives me a twinge of anxiety when I don't hear the response. I wonder whether they really know what they are doing with this most sacred of realities. We hold the salvation of the world in our hands and in our bodies.

Likewise, it is expected that the recipient will bow slightly – not exaggerated! – as you are about to stand before the minister to receive the sacrament.

It is a small but real part of putting our faith into action.

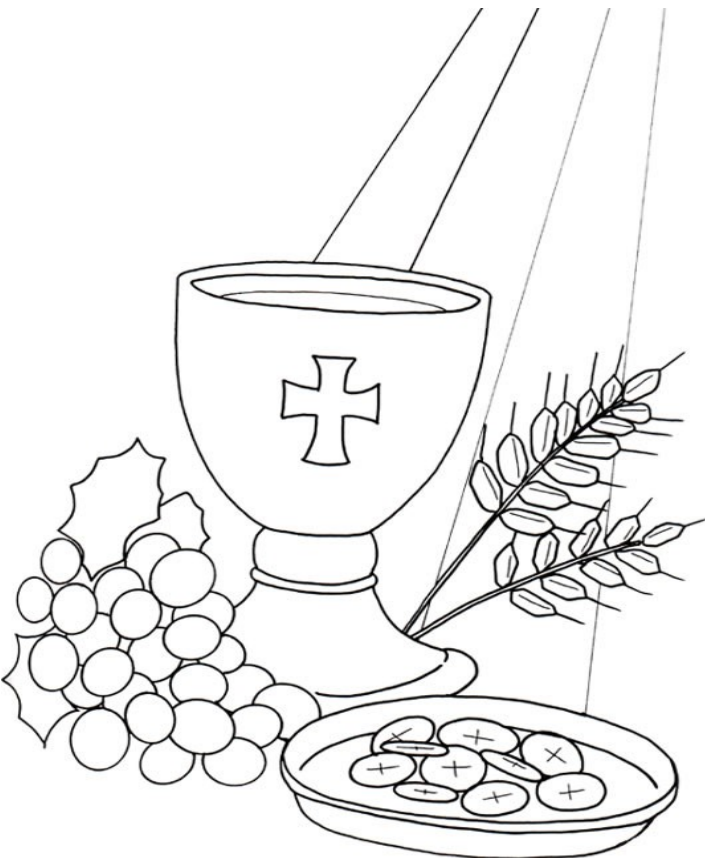

The Body and Blood of Christ

When Jesus went back to Heaven He didn't want to leave us all alone, so He gave Himself to us in the Holy Eucharist. First He gave Himself to the Apostles at the Last Supper, and today He gives Himself to us in Holy Communion.

Normally when we eat something it gets absorbed into our body. But receiving Jesus in Holy Communion does something different. It makes us more into Jesus' Body! It brings our soul closer to God and closer to all the other people in the Church. That's what "Communion" means.

When we go to Communion in a state of grace we can get so much more grace from God. Our venial (small) sins can be taken away and we can get more strength to do His will. In fact, the time that your prayers are the most powerful is right after you receive Holy Communion, when Jesus is right inside you. He is your closest friend and only wants what is good for you. When you go to Communion remember who you just received and don't forget to thank Him for coming to you!

Cake Stall Fundraiser

The Cake Stall will benefit not only our parish but also De La Salle College, Bomana, Papua New Guinea. The closest neighbor to our Dominican College in PNG was a boys' secondary school, De La Salle College, begun in 1964. A report in the Lasallian Foundation newsletter reads:

'There are currently 1200 boys attending the college, primarily from low-income families, including a number of students in their early 20s who dropped out of other schools when they were younger.'

'Free education in PNG was introduced in 2013, which has substantially increased enrolments... However, the local schools have not received additional Government funding support to expand or improve their infrastructure....This has led to overcrowding in many classrooms with up to 55 students [per class] at Bomana...'

'Renovations and upgrading of the infrastructure, electricals and facilities is a key priority for the college.' I spoke with the principal, Br Antony Swamy fsc, not long before I left Bomana for Adelaide. I told him that I would ask the parish to support his school's need, which pleased him. Please contribute what you can to this project of Catholic education in Papua New Guinea.
