Come to me, all you who labour and are overburdened"

Jesus' words today resonate with us, or people we know. For many people the restrictions required by Covid 19 are a nuisance and not much more. Still we understand that there are many, even just here in Adelaide, for whom life at present is full of anxiety – over employment, money, business, investment, safety, mental health, career path, ... the list goes on. Added to that the stress placed on health care workers. Let's not forget the decision makers in governments. They have to respond quickly and take hard decisions, and suffer criticism. (But how good that the voice of the people brought about a u-turn in the public transport plan!)







Jesus' words might sound empty to many. Coming to him may not change what we suffer. Coming to him means coming to the man who was crucified. And rose again. He took away many burdens in his life of preaching and healing. But in the end he took them all upon himself. Our sufferings are on him. They are offered to the Father in every Mass.

That does not mean that we don't have to come to the help of suffering people. We can be moved, by Jesus example, to take their sufferings on ourselves, in acts of compassion. A prayer I have learned recently says it like this: 'May my heart be a basket of kindness. Help me to share its treasures freely with others: a smile, a gesture, a listening ear, the sacrifice of my comfort and time.' Sometimes it takes even more: advocacy before authority, standing alongside in facing obstructions or threats. We can be stronger with the faith that Jesus has faced it all himself.

At Rosary hall, we are still limited to 100 people. For the 10am Mass only I ask you to book in advance. You can book for one week at a time. Book by phoning or emailing the parish office. Tell us how many people you are booking in, give the names and a contact number or email address. The contact details for the parish office are in Dominews. When you arrive, sign off your name on the list provided.

We are now legally able to gather 130 people in St Laurence's church. But with social distancing it will be hard to accommodate this number. In fact, the numbers at Mass are less than 100. For the time being, Mass will be celebrated at St Laurence's on Saturday at 6pm, Sunday at 9 and 11 am, and again on Sunday at 5.30pm. These Masses seem to have enough room - especially Sunday at 5.30. Hello ...?


" I Will Give You Rest"
