WELCOME BROTHER CHRISTIAN



Brother Christian Elters OP, is one of the Dominican students, visiting us in St Laurence's Priory for the second semester. He is here for pastoral experience and will be present both in the parish and in Blackfriars Priory School. In the parish, I have asked him to take special interest in young couples with school-aged children. He will be present at either of the Mass centres each weekend. He will also take part in other aspects of parish life, in cooperation with the parish office. Please give him a warm welcome, in your usual way.

He is not yet a deacon, but is a lector and acolyte, so is qualified to be a reader at Mass, and a minister of Holy Communion. I hope that he will have the opportunity to

exercise these ministries among us, as he has been used to doing in his home community of Melbourne. Oh no, he's come from Victoria! Don't panic, he has done his 14 days quarantine, self-isolated at St Laurence's, and is healthy. Deo Gratias.

This week, and next week there will be celebrations of First Reconciliation, or First Confession, for the children of our parish. This is a good time for the rest of us to think about this sacrament, and what it's for – forgiveness of sin. For the believer in Jesus, sin never makes us despair since Jesus himself is the cure.

Every sin is committed for the sake of some good, but if that choice is contradictory to the love of God, that is 'mortal' sin. If that choice leaves room for the love of God to continue in us, that is 'venial' sin. Some sins are 'mortal' by nature (blasphemy, perjury, murder, adultery). These, when chosen with full freedom and deliberation, bring the guilt of mortal sin on the sinner.

Do we get complacent about sin? Does it seem that 'venial' sin is not serious? How can that be? When I commit any sin, I turn my back on the love of God and choose something else that I want more. How can that not be serious? We need to be more realistic about sin.

'Love the sinner, hate the sin' is a principle derived from the work of St Augustine.

Hating the sin, the Church proclaims what love of God demands. In doing so we are often found to be opposed to the prevailing culture, or a 'spoil sport'. This is especially so in the case of human life questions, and sexual questions.

Loving the sinner, we sinners welcome other sinners as our brothers and sisters. In opposing law that legalises sin, or some of the places where sin is practiced we show mercy to the sinner, imitating the mercy of God. If our opposition provokes legal measures for the protection of sinners, perhaps we have neglected love for the sinner?
