All to the Glory of God





'The fruit of the earth and the work of human hands' at Rosary church.

I hope to encourage you to lift up your voices to the glory of God as we trial a period when **we will all say the whole psalm** in response to the first reading, at Sunday Mass in both churches.

From the feedback last week I found that this used to be done at St Laurence's, and those who remembered it would welcome a return to that practice.

During this trial period, when the reader has finished the first reading, he or she will omit the "response" and begin the verses of the psalm for you to join in. The text is printed in Dominews. If you have Sunday Missals, you will find the text there too.

Why do this?

- To give the voice of the congregation a greater participation in the Mass,
- For a greater familiarity with the Book of Psalms in the Bible, and to pray them,
- To highlight even more the pre-eminence of the reading of the Word of God, distinct from our response to it.

How long a trial period? I plan to review it after a month, and see if there are any problems; then another month with any adjustments necessary; then make it ongoing, or scrap it.


There has been one reservation: the response to the reading is supposed to be 'meditative'. 'Meditative' can be resting in silence. Is our current practice 'meditative' in this way? Or is it just more listening? I believe reading aloud can be meditative too. We will say words which respond to the reading we listened to. This week it might be 'Do not remember the sins of my youth'.


If the psalms bring some difficulties remember that these are prayers which Jesus prayed, in the synagogue, or with his disciples. (Mt 26:30; Mk 14:26) It can be helpful to ask how he prayed them.

# Two Sons in the Vineyard

In today's Gospel reading, Jesus tells a story to show how different people obey what God has called them to do. In this parable there are two sons whose father asked them to help in the vineyard. The first son told his father he wouldn't help, but then changed his mind and did what he was asked. The second son said he would help, but he didn't. In the end it doesn't matter so much if we say we are going to do what's right. What is important is that we do it. We call ourselves Christians because we believe in Jesus and the Church He gave us, but we only really are being Christians if we do what He says. He wants us to realize that what we do is more important than what we say we will do.
