That is the full title under which our Prospect church

was established, according to the foundation stone at

our 800-year history. The story that the Rosary began when Our Lady gave it to St Dominic, and/or St Catherine, is a myth. This story no doubt reflects the way the Rosary has been used extensively by preachers to teach people the mysteries of our salvation.

Because the Rosary is such a peoples' prayer, when Pope St John Paul II suggested an extra set of 5 mysteries, 'the mysteries of light', I was skeptical that it would catch on. But such was the popularity of this pope, that it has indeed caught on.

One of the strengths of the Rosary is that the mysteries can be easily memorized. Then it does not need a book or anything else to be prayed.

Not even beads, if you have ten fingers!

But there are helps to pray it well, meditating on the mysteries: Scripture passages; meditations on the scripture; images illustrating the mystery; prayers to sum up our response to the mystery.

Above all, the words of the simple, common, well-known prayers, Our Father, Hail Mary, Glory Be, are treasures when said attentively, carefully, reflectively. We call God our Father, as Jesus taught us; we praise God's work in Mary and ask her help; we give glory to God as we are called to do for eternity. Let us not get into the habit of saying them mechanically, distracted, not thinking what we are saying.

All these things will be part of praying the Rosary this Sunday afternoon at 2 pm in Rosarv church.

There have often been campaigns of prayer with the Rosary. Let campaigns to not distract us from formation in the mysteries of salvation as we pray the Rosary. They are the mysteries of Our Lord's life, death and resurrection, as seen through the eyes of his mother, the Blessed Virgin, the Immaculate Conception.


Others will lead the prayers of each decade. Please let me know now, otherwise I will have to recruit on the day.


Divine Mercy Devotion
