

You will probably have seen this poster on the notice boards over the last few years.

Let us now look carefully at our parish in the light of Pope Francis' words:

'The parish is the presence of the Church in a given territory, an environment for hearing God's word, for growth in the Christian life, for dialogue, proclamation, charitable outreach, worship and celebration.' (*The Joy of the Gospel, 28*)

Then he went on to say: '. We must admit, though, that the call to review and renew our parishes has not yet sufficed to bring them nearer to people, to make them environments of living communion and participation, and to make them completely mission -oriented.' (*Ibid.*)

Now our Parish Pastoral Council asks us to take

up the challenge of Pope Francis to review and renew our parish. Take each of the Eight Gospel Pathways, and ask 'how could our parish make more progress along this pathway?' Record your response on the paper next to the poster, or send an email to me or the parish office:

1. The parish is a prayerful community in which each member is called to a personal relationship with Jesus.

2. Eucharistic liturgies are prayerful and fully participative.

3. The Word of God is known, loved and proclaimed in good preaching and in faithful lives.

4. There is a warm sense of community outreach and welcome.

5. The parish community is visibly engaged with those who experience poverty and need, and with those at the margins of society and church.

6. The parish witnesses to God's love for all the creatures of Earth.

7. The parish is a community of diverse gifts and charisms, each recognised and nurtured in the community, and coordinated by the parish priest and leadership team.

8. Eucharistic communities that are viable will be enabled to continue.

The Archdiocese has elaborated each of them. I will add this to Dominews over succeeding weeks.



Our Calling is to Love one Another



After gaining her freedom she dedicated her life to sharing her story and to supporting the poor and suffering. She eventually became a Canossian Sister and was canonised in 2000.
