The Temptation of Christ




We pray 'lead us not into temptation', but Jesus was tempted. He shared our human weakness, but overcame it. He was tempted but was without sin. He was able to overcome the power of the tempter with the power of God. We also want the power of God on our side when we face temptation. That is what we pray.

Temptation is a test. By being tested, we know our strength. It could be like a champion athlete or team who wants to prove they are the best. They oppose another team or competitor, and overcome them.

Success in a test does not come easily. Competitors in a test will prepare themselves with training. It's hard work, boring work. The prospect of victory helps to keep them going.

Perhaps our greatest test will be at our death. (As one gets older, one thinks more about it.) At any rate, it will be the final test. Will we pass it? Will we find we have prepared for it well? The observances of Lent are a good measure of our preparation. They are what Christians should be doing all the time: putting God first, putting myself last, practical charity.



I was told that 'oldies' don't like telling the priest what to do. (That's why not many have responded to the Eight Gospel Pathways.) I don't believe it. It's not what I have experienced during 50 years or more.

If it's true, it's something to overcome. It's part of the vice of 'clericalism'. That contributed so much to the evil of child abuse.

Get used to telling the priest what to do. It's a large part of 'the synodal church'. Pope Francis wishes the bishops to take this seriously in the next synod of bishops. And did you notice that the Pope and the Archbishop have asked for your

suggestions for that? Have you done so?

Parish Pastoral Councils, and Parish Finance Councils exist to tell the priest what to do. Or to 'advise'.

It has been instructive to take part in appointing applicants to a position in a school. I have taken part several times in Adelaide, and Melbourne. If priests were subject to the same rigorous tests that teachers are, you would have much better priests.

Temptation

All of us have faced temptations, haven't we? It may have been that piece of cake you were told not to eat until after dinner. Or maybe watching an extra half hour of TV when you should have been doing your homework. Did you know that Jesus was tempted just as we are? The Bible tells us that Jesus was led by the Holy Spirit into the desert where he was tempted by the devil for forty days. Do you know what Jesus did when he faced temptation? He turned to Scripture!

Jesus had not had anything to eat for forty days. He was hungry, and Satan knew he was hungry, so he said to him, "If you are really the Son of God, turn these stones into bread."

Jesus could have easily done what Satan suggested, but he didn't. Instead, he answered, "It is written, 'Man does not live by bread alone.'"

Then the devil took Jesus up to a high place and showed him the worldly kingdoms below. "All of this belongs to me," he said. "If you will bow down and worship me, I will give it to you."

Jesus answered, "It is written, 'Worship the Lord your God and serve him only.'"
Next, the devil took Jesus to Jerusalem and led him up to the highest point on the temple. He said to Jesus, "If you are the Son of God, throw yourself down from here. God will send his angels to rescue you."

Again, Jesus quoted the Scripture, "'Do not put the Lord your God to the test.'"

Do you know what the devil did? He gave up! He said, "I'll come back and try another day."

Dear Father, help us to learn what the Bible teaches us to do so that when we face temptations we can do what Jesus did—use Scripture to overcome. In Jesus' name we pray. Amen.
