FROM HOLY WEEK TO EASTER WEEK



These two weeks celebrate the peak of the life of the Body of Christ. Several days are of particular importance. They are celebrated with rituals which are observed only at this time of the year.

Holy Week begins today, with **Palm Sunday** of **the Passion.** The Mass begins with blessing of palm branches. A Gospel passage is read which records Jesus' arrival in Jerusalem, greeted by cheering crowds. They waved palm branches we are told, laid cloaks on the road in front of Jesus' donkey, and shouted 'Hosanna' – the

greeting for a victorious king. We take part in that in a ritual way with branches of greenery which are blessed, and can be kept at home for a remembrance.

Palm Sunday is also notable for the reading of the story from the Gospel of Jesus' last hours before his death. (It is a long reading – we stand for the Gospel, but people can sit down when they get tired.) We hear how the leaders of the people turned the joyful crowds against Jesus, because they were determined to eliminate him, with the connivance of the Roman governor. We hear how our king suffered agony as he foresaw his death; he suffered an unjust condemnation, unmerited punishment, cruel mockery, and finally an excruciating death. We observe how fickle the crowds are, who had cheered him but then called 'crucify him'. We recall that we are just as fickle. We hear how Jesus was betrayed by one of his closest followers, and realise that our sins also betray him.

Holy Week continues with **Holy Thursday**, on which we commemorate the Last Supper, that Jesus had with his disciples before his suffering and death. We learn how he showed his disciples that his role was to serve them, and empowered them to serve others in his name. He did this by performing for them a servant's task, the washing of their feet. A parish family will receive this service of washing of feet by the priest acting in the name of Jesus. We also learn how Jesus gave the Church his body and blood in sacramental form of bread and wine – 'the whole treasure of the Church'. At Mass, as always, we join Jesus and the disciples at the Last Supper. We again resolve not to repeat the treachery of Judas by falling into sin. At the end of this Mass we show special honour to the Blessed Sacrament in procession, and spend an hour in adoration.

Good Friday follows, in which the Church is silent and stark, in mourning over the death of Jesus. In a liturgy like no other we read how Jesus' death was foretold, and again hear the story of that last fateful day. In our prayers of intercession, in the name of Christ the High Priest, we offer to God the whole world for which he died so that it could be made holy. We venerate the cross to which we may genuflect, or bow in worship of him who gained salvation through his death on the cross.

On Holy Saturday the Church is abandoned, for our king is entombed - until the **Easter Vigil**, after dark. The light of Christ risen from the dead begins to shine in the darkened church, first in the Paschal Candle, lit from a blessed fire.

The candle is adorned with symbols of Christ's victory over death. The candle is greeted with praise and offered to God as a humble acceptance of the new life of Christ, risen from the dead, now living in us, through Baptism. So we also hear an extended Liturgy of the Word, as fitting for this most holy night. We recall God's eternal plan for our salvation, reaching its fulfilment in the Resurrection of Jesus. To embrace that life in ourselves again we bless water for Baptism, renew our profession of faith that we made at Baptism, or which was made for us, and receive a sprinkling of that water which bathed us when we were born again. Finally we take part again in the Eucharist, receiving the food which nourishes this new life.

Easter is so great that its celebration lasts a whole week – Easter Week. It is as if Easter Sunday is a whole week long.

At the end of Easter Week the Church can hold a celebration of **Divine Mercy**, the mercy which is shown at its highest in the Paschal Mystery which we celebrated during the past two weeks. This will be observed at Rosary Church this year on Sunday afternoon and at the evening Mass. See the notice board and/or take a flyer for details. For the sake of this celebration there will be Confession available through the afternoon. There is also Confession available before each weekday Mass, and on Good Friday after the Stations of the Cross.
