HOLY COMMUNION RECEIVED ON THE TONGUE



Some of the restrictions imposed to guard against infection during the pandemic have been removed. There is still the danger of infection, but for pastoral reasons the Archbishop has now allowed us to put holy water in the 'stoups' or holy water bowls at the doors of the churches. This began again in our parish at the Easter Vigil.

The Archbishop has also removed the restriction from receiving Holy Communion on the tongue. This is important for some people. It is a legitimate way of receiving Holy Communion, and no one who wants to receive the sacrament in this way can be denied.



Let us review what the Church expects of communicants.

The first and most important condition is that the communicant be in the state of grace. It is a grave sin to receive Holy Communion in a state of mortal sin. Confession is offered frequently in our churches, and will be celebrated on request at other times.

The second condition is to be fasting for one hour before Holy Communion, from food and drink, except plain water. If necessary for health, medication can always be taken. This shows the respect due to the Eucharist which is not ordinary food. We become what we receive. Jesus receives us.

The attitude of the communicant receiving the sacrament of the Lord's Body and Blood is one of adoration. We acknowledge that Our Lord is truly present in the consecrated bread and wine: body, blood, soul and divinity. It is our God who comes to visit us in this sacrament. We adore him.

This is why some people are upset at the idea of receiving Holy Communion in the hand. It is a reasonable and understandable feeling. It is true that we easily lose sight of the truth of this sacrament when Holy Communion becomes so 'ordinary' as to receive it in the palm of our hands. The sacrament of the Eucharist is not at all 'ordinary', but the greatest reality of all, a divine reality.

Communion in the hand has become a widespread custom and there is no official suggestion that it should be stopped. However, it is an exception to the rule of the universal church that the normal way to receive Holy Communion is on the tongue. This has never been forbidden, except in the case of necessity, the necessity of protecting public health.

Holy Communion will be given on the tongue in our churches, on request, from now on.

INTRODUCTORY RITES continued. GLORIA. Sung on Sundays and the feasts, though not on the Sundays of Lent and Advent .. so that it can ring out with fresh vigour on the feasts for which these seasons prepare us. It is an angelic song, beginning with

the words which the angels sang to the shepherds on the night Christ was born. .. By using the angels' same words we know that we are singing with them now .. they are singing with us. We are singing for the same reason .. that God has sent his Son among us born in our same flesh. .. In the first part of the song our words are addressed to God the Father. The language is insistent. .. Then we turn to address Jesus Christ himself .. 'the only Son of the Father.' Then we cry out to him as 'the Lamb who takes away the sin of the world,' and so in the midst of our praise we beg him again for mercy. .. In the presence of the all-holy God we must beg for mercy. This hymn .. concludes by exulting again in the Triune name of God: 'Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit, in the glory of God the Father.' (pp. 26-27)

Doubting Thomas

In today's Bible lesson we learn that on the Sunday that Jesus rose from the grave, He appeared to a group of His disciples. One of the disciples, whose name was Thomas, was not with them. When the disciples told Thomas that they had seen Jesus and that He was alive, Thomas said, "I won't believe it until I see it with my own eyes. I want to put my finger in the nail-prints in His hands—and place my hand where the spear was thrust into His side.

A week later, Thomas saw Jesus. Jesus invited Thomas to touch His hands where the nails had been. He told Thomas to put his hand in the wound in His side. Then Thomas believed! Jesus said to him, "Because you have seen me, you have believed. Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have believed."

A lot of people today won't believe that Jesus really rose from the grave because they haven't seen Him with their own two eyes. Do you know what? It is true whether they believe it or not! You and I have never seen Jesus, but we believe. We accept Him by faith. We don't have to see it to believe it!

Dear Jesus, thank You that You help us accept by faith that You have risen from the grave and that You are alive. In Jesus' name, amen.
