#### THEOLOGICAL SCIENCE







Outsiders are often under the impression that the Church *decides* things. For instance, they think that saying that this or that kind of action is morally right or wrong is a *decision*, a decision rather than a determination of fact. It is convenient, ... to treat doctrine as what we *decide* to believe. But ... the whole point of our encounter with God is that it is an encounter with Truth itself, ..

Theology is a science. It determines things. .. Theology asks 'what is true?'...

Theology is a science *and it uses the methods of science*. That .. is not an invention of medieval academics. We see it in action at the Council of Jerusalem [in Acts 15:7-21, where the infant Church decides that pagans, or Gentiles, do not have to obey the law of Moses].

A science has data, and a scientific discussion starts from the data and makes sense of them...

Even in Luke's compressed account, it is clear that the Council [of Jerusalem] is not having a 'what shall we choose to say?' discussion, but a 'what is true?' discussion: that is to say, a scientific one. Such discussions are of a fundamentally different nature from political or decision-making ones. It is not about getting a majority on the committee. It is about taking the data, however discordant they may seem, and making sense of them all. That is what science is. Is this an impossible goal, or a possible one? In the case of the physical world we believe that it can be done because we believe that the physical world really exists. When it comes to theological matters we know that it can be done because we know that we are commanded to love the Lord our God with all our mind: that is to say, we are told that God makes sense.

Arguments will never cease, of course. That is the glory of having one race made up of many minds. But we do need to remember that when we believe, the root of our belief is not decision but truth. Then our arguments, and even our disagreements, can be truly scientific in the original, root, sense of the word: 'productive of knowledge'. (Anon. from *Universalis* app, About Today, Thursday of the 5<sup>th</sup> week of Eastertide)

Consider the Mystery of the Trinity: it is not 'politically correct' or 'cool'. It follows necessarily from what we believe about Jesus and the Holy Spirit, salvation and grace. And we believe these because of what has been revealed to us in the scriptures. Are our Diocesan Assemblies and the Australian Church Council an encounter with Truth, or a political process?


### **MARRIAGE MATTERS**

THE EVENT CHARACTER OF THE PROCLAMATION OF THE WORD. The Word proclaimed in liturgy is ... the whole reality to which the words bear testimony made present. ... As simple as that sounds, the Trinity can be hard to understand. The three persons in the Blessed Trinity are all equal but different. We cannot understand this, but we believe it because Jesus taught it. It is a mystery to us - something we can think about and wonder about. People have used many different things to try and help explain what the Trinity is. Take for example, an egg. It has three parts- the shell, the white and the yolk, but together it makes up an egg.
