Reconciled – justified – saved



St Paul uses several different images to convey the unique work of Christ. Here he uses 'reconciled', 'justified', 'saved'. Is there any difference between them? We have been reconciled and justified by Christ's death, and we shall be saved by his life, presumably by his risen and glorious life after the Resurrection, which will lead us to share with him in glory; this is still in the future, the end product.

But we have already been reconciled with God. The enmity which we, the human race, put between ourselves and God by our constant rebellion has been dissolved by the overwhelming act of Jesus' love for his Father. The love of Christ surpasses the disobedience and hostility of Adam, the human race, in which we all shared.

Paul also says that we have been justified or made righteous by Christ's death. Human righteousness, being right with God, is always dependent on God's own righteousness. God's righteousness is his fidelity to his promises to save. In fulfilling those promises God is being true to himself and his word, and so is righteous. We are brought under that same righteousness by the fulfilment of the promises in Christ. So we are already reconciled and justified, and will be saved by Christ's life.

WHAT HAPPENS AT MASS

THE EVENT CHARACTER OF THE PROCLAMATION OF THE WORD.

We can turn now to the form and order of the ritual in which the Word is proclaimed at Mass. All that we have said here is given concrete form by what we read, how we read, who reads, and the order in which we read. This form and order express that the centre of what is proclaimed is the death and Resurrection of

Jesus. The spreading out of many scriptural texts throughout the liturgical year repeats in our community experience and understanding what the Church in each generation discovers with awe and wonder: that the meaning of the whole creation and the whole of human history is revealed in the mystery of the death and Resurrection of Jesus.
