RESPECT FOR THE SACREDNESS OF HUMAN LIFE



It is not your business or mine to blame or condemn anybody for procuring an abortion or for taking their own life or the life of another.

Now the faith of the Catholic Church on human life, its origin and end, is clear. The following selected extracts from the Catechism of the Catholic Church express some main points. The wording is from the original. The numbers refer to paragraphs in the Catechism:

Human life is sacred because from its beginning it involves the creative action of God and it remains for ever in a special relationship with the creator, who is its sole end. God alone is the Lord of life from its beginning until its end: no one can under any circumstances claim for himself the right directly to destroy an innocent human being. (2258)

Human life must be respected and protected absolutely from the moment of conception. From the first moment of his existence, a human being must be recognised as having the rights of a person – among which is the inviolable right of every innocent being to life. (2270; and cf Jer 1:5; Job 10:8-12; Pss 22(21):10-11; 139(138):15)

Since the first century the Church has affirmed the moral evil of every procured abortion. This teaching has not changed and remains unchangeable. Direct abortion, that is to say, abortion willed either as an end or a means, is gravely contrary to the moral law. (2271)

Those whose lives are diminished or weakened deserve special respect. Sick or handicapped persons should be helped to lead lives as normal as possible. (2276)

Whatever its motives and means, direct euthanasia consists in putting an end to the lives of handicapped, sick, or dying persons. It is morally unacceptable. (2277)

The error of judgement into which one can fall in good faith does not change the nature of this ... act [euthanasia], which must always be forbidden and excluded. (2277)

We are stewards, not owners, of the life God has entrusted to us. It is not ours to dispose of. (2280)

Grave psychological disturbances, anguish, or grave fear of hardship, suffering or torture can diminish the responsibility of the one committing suicide. (2282)

We should not despair of the eternal salvation of persons who have taken their own lives. By ways known to him alone, God can provide the opportunity for salutary repentance. The Church prays for persons who have taken their own lives. (2283)


HAT HAPPENS THE EVENT CHARACTER OF THE PROCLAMATION OF THE WORD.

The scriptures are read in a certain order .. that follows the structure of salvation history; .. the liturgy begins with a text from the Old Testament, where creation and the history of Israel are encountered, and moves towards the climax of

proclamation of the Gospel. .. the Gospel is the the climax and centre of the scripture .. because Christ himself is the fulfilment of creation and the history of Israel. Thus, for a Christian, only from the perspective of the Gospel is the Old Testament text understood in its fulness, or .. only in Christ are creation and the history of Israel understood. Some readings from the writings of the apostles forms a link between the Gospel and Old contemplative insight, a theological Testament, a insight that helps bind the event of the Gospel to the event of the OldTestament. Jesus tells his disciples that they better not keep him a secret from others. He tells them that the words he has shared with them should then be shared by them, later on, with everyone.

The disciples listened to Jesus! They did not keep what they knew about Jesus a secret. Instead, they shared Jesus' words and actions with

others! Because the disciples shared what they knew about Jesus and who Jesus was, others have been able to better know God's healing, hope, and love including us!

And, just like the disciples shared with others, we can also share our own words and actions of God's healing, hope, and love that we've learned from Jesus. Instead of keeping these words and experiences that bring life to this world locked up, we can do just like the disciples did and share those words and experiences of Jesus with the world!
