POPE FRANCIS AND THE SYNOD ON SYNODALITY



On July 7 the Synod's secretariate published the full list (..) of those who will be participating in the XVI Ordinary General Assembly of the Synod of Bishops, which will take place October 4-29 at the Vatican.

And while most of the prelates who are listed have been elected either by national or regional episcopal conferences, or (..) will be participating in an ex officio capacity, the pope has hand-picked more than 50 others...

What's interesting about 'Bergolio's list' (..) is that .. Francis is trying to use the synodal process, in defiance

of widespread cynicism and indifference, to save the Church from internal polarization. .he's well aware that Catholics of all points of view must be part of the synodal process, his audacious project to reform and re-energize the Church's sense of communion, participation and mission.

.. the pope has done an impressive job of trying to strike a balance. He has answered episcopal conferences (..) who have been hostile or lukewarm towards his pontificate by personally appointing delegates from those same regions who are his supporters. On the other hand, Francis has appointed more 'traditionalist' participants to the Synod assembly from places .. where the so-called 'progressives' were elected by episcopal conferences...

Francis has also introduced another complete novelty to the Synod's structure ...

The Bishop of Rome is the president of the Synod of Bishops but he usually appoints three cardinals to serve as 'president delegates' during the general assemblies. That's the way it has been since Paul VI instituted this modern-day version of the Synod of the Roman Church and held its first assembly in 1967. But Pope Francis has now shattered that 57-year-long custom and has appointed nine president delegates – and only one of them wears the red hat...

Among the other eight is an Eastern Church patriarch from Egypt, three other bishops (from Ecuador, Australia [Tim Costello of Perth] and the United States) an Italian priest, a religious sister from Mexico and a female lay missionary from Japan.

The message here is that any member of the People of God (both ordained and non-ordained) can preside over the Synod of Bishops as the pope's delegate. This is a radical step forward ..

Francis' innovation in this regard should not be passed over quickly. He's made an important statement by allowing members of the lay faithful to preside at the synodal proceedings.



THE OLD TESTAMENT READING

Let us take an example that briefly mentions many of the **themes** .. that might be slowly heard during the course of the year as Old Testament texts are read in the liturgy...In the original **creation** the whole world may be understood to be God's

temple. Sin destroys our capacity to live in the world as God's temple, but the covenant with Abraham and Moses can be viewed as moving toward the building of a temple in Jerusalem, where once again God's presence in our midst is known and celebrated. But we can only hear these texts thinking of Jesus, and all that they say gives us language and images for thinking of him. Jesus transposes the key in which the temple of his day is understood. By his death he mysteriously destroyed it, as he had predicted. And in three days a new temple, his risen and glorified body is raised up. But these patterns reach all the way to us now, for as Saint Paul says, we are that temple built of living stones. (pp. 39-40)

God's Word is like Seeds


In today's Gospel reading, Jesus explains the parable of the sower and the seed to the disciples. The seed that the sower was planting in the story represents the teachings of God's Word. Our heart represents the soil where the sower planted the seeds. Like seeds, the word of God comes to all sorts of people.

If our heart is hard and filled with anger and bitterness, the teaching falls on hard ground and never grows, just like the seed that fell on the hard ground in the parable that Jesus told. There are other times when we hear the Word and we get excited about it, but then our excitement fades away because our understanding isn't that deep. That's the way it was with the seed that fell on the rocky soil. Sometimes we hear the Word and we believe what

it says, but we want to keep on doing the same things we have been doing. That is like planting the seed in with a bunch of weeds. I'm sure you can guess what happens. The weeds will soon take over!

The last seed is the best, it fell on the good ground. If you learn from what you hear in church and from the Bible, the seed that Jesus plants in your heart will grow. Your life will produce good fruit just like Jesus intended. You will be helping others to grow in their knowledge and understanding of God's love.

Our Father, help us to be like the good soil in our lesson today. Help us to listen to your Word and grow up to be the kind of boys and girls you want us to be. In Jesus' name we pray. Amen.
