The Third World Day for Grandparents and Elderly



From Archbishop Patrick:

'This year, on the third celebration of 'World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly' on Sunday, 23rd July 2023, The Holy Father Pope Francis has chosen a passage from the Gospel of Luke "His mercy is from age to age", (Luke 1:50) as the theme is to emphasise the link between this celebration and World Youth Day (1st - 6th August, 2023).'

The theme is taken from Mary's great canticle, 'The Magnificat'. She prayed this in response to her cousin Elizabeth's greeting, 'why should I be honoured with a visit from the mother of my Lord?' (Luke 1:43)

In this scene, both Mary and Elizabeth are pregnant. Elizabeth is carrying the forerunner who will become known as John the Baptist. Mary is bearing the Saviour, Our Lord Jesus Christ. Both pregnancies are full of wonder, more than usual. Elizabeth is elderly, past the age of childbearing. Nevertheless, she is chosen by God to be the mother of John. God's promise is never to be despaired of. Mary has become a mother in spite of her lacking a husband. Our God is the Lord of life.

We see the necessary link between the generations, not only for bodily human life, but supremely for the passing on of the supernatural life of faith. On this day we honour our grandparents, and all elderly people, who have been given the gift of life and have handed it on to us. We also thank our grandparents for the faith which they have handed on to our parents, who in turn have handed it on to us.

A prayer for The Blessing of Long Life

God of mercy,

Who has given the gift of long life to Your children, grant them Your blessing;

let them feel the sweetness and strength of Your presence: Turning back to the past let them rejoice in Your mercy

and looking to the future

Let them persevere in the hope that does not die.

Praise and glory to You for ever and ever.





THE OLD TESTAMENT READING contd. Finally .. the one who reads. Who should do this, and how is it best done? .. we choose one of the baptised. To read in the liturgy is one of the great privileges of our Baptism. .. we should marvel at the grace that enables one of us to stand up and be used as an instrument through which the holy and

life-giving Word of God is announced in the assembly. .. the more the reader is conscious of this, the more effectively the Word will be proclaimed. The reader's own understanding and faith must appear in the act of reading, the reader's own living of the patterns and realities which the text expresses. In short, holiness of life, and not mere rhetorical technique, makes for effective reading. .. we hear between the lines of the reading the reader's own struggle in discipleship, and we are encouraged by this in our own. 
their eyes see you in all things; And may they proclaim your glory as they walk in the ways of Jesus Christ, our Lord and Saviour. Amen.

Weeds Among the Wheat

As you probably know, one of the biggest enemies of a good garden is weeds. Weeds will rob the soil of the nutrients that help your plants to grow and many times they will choke out good plants. In today's parable, Jesus tells about a man who lets the

weeds grow along with the wheat until harvest time, so that the good plants don't get pulled up along with the weeds. In this story, the weeds represent people who do bad things - sinners. God doesn't want to destroy the weeds immediately because he doesn't want any harm to come to the wheat while doing so. He also wants to give sinners the chance to change and be sorry for what they have done. This shows us how merciful God is.


Dear Father, thank you for your mercy and help us to love one another and leave the matter of judgment in your hands. In Jesus' name we pray. Amen.


