A letter from the Archbishop RE: The Voice Referendum

In 2017, The Uluru Statement from the Heart was presented to the Australian Government by Australian Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander leaders. It called for reforms to address disparities between Indigenous and non-Indigenous Australians, specifically providing a constitutionally protected First Nations Voice and a Makarrata Commission (a process of conflict resolution, peacemaking, and justice). A copy of this statement is available to view on your church noticeboard.

On 14th October 2023, all Australian citizens will vote in the referendum on the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Voice to Parliament. Over the past months, many community leaders and leaders of organisations have put forward cases for and against this proposed alteration to our constitution.

We will be asked the question:

'A Proposed Law: to alter the Constitution to recognise the First Peoples of Australia by establishing an Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Voice. Do you approve this proposed alteration?'

The Australian Catholic Bishop's Conference (ACBC) released a statement regarding an Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander voice to parliament in May, 2023. In this statement, the ACBC stated:

'This is an important moment in the history of the nation, and it can help us to move towards a deep and just reconciliation. It also offers a mechanism to improve the lives of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Peoples. We urge all Australians to engage in the debate productively, respecting each other and accepting that people may, in good faith, have differing concerns and perspectives. We are an open democracy, and this is a moment to use our democratic institutions to produce a high-quality debate shaped by a genuine concern to do justice and bring healing to First Nations Peoples.'

The words of Pope Francis also speak to us at this time of discernment, reminding us of our obligation to advocate for the marginalised in the pursuit of the common good:

"Even in the developed world, the effects of unjust structures and actions are all too apparent. Our efforts must aim at restoring hope, righting wrongs, maintaining commitments, and thus promoting the well-being of individuals and of peoples.

Throughout September, I am asking all Parishes and Communities to prayerfully reflect on this upcoming referendum. I encourage all Catholics to consider this important issue and inform themselves from reliable sources such as: www.indigenousvoice.church, www.catholic.au, or voice.gov.au.

Please pray the prayer for 'The Voice' regularly in your Parishes and families in the lead up to the referendum. The Frequently Asked Questions flyer, produced by the Justice, Healing and Inclusion Team may address questions you have about the referendum. It is an excellent resource which draws on information from the National Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Catholic Council (NATSICC).

THE PROCLAMATION OF THE GOSPEL .. to hear any one part of the Gospel on any given day is our way, our entry, that day into the whole mystery of the Resurrection. The Gospel is always about the death and Resurrection of Jesus. Whatever else it tells has its purpose placing the mystery of his Passion in its fuller context. .. the second reading is taken from the apostolic *letters*. The gospel genre

arose several decades later in order to meet a growing need for a more extended narrative of the life of Jesus. This would keep the concentration on the death and Resurrection from turning into an abstraction. (p.48)


If You Want to be Forgiven

In today's Gospel reading, Jesus tells the story of a king whose servant owed him a lot of money. The king was going to punish the servant, but when the man knelt down and begged for mercy, the king forgave him. Then the same servant went and punished someone else who owed him money. When the king found out about this, he was very angry.

Has anyone ever done something mean to you? How do you feel when that happens? Do you feel loving toward that person? In this story, Jesus is telling us that if we want God to forgive us our sins then we have to forgive the people who have hurt us. Jesus wants us to keep forgiving and forgiving no matter what- forgive endlessly! We can't keep record of wrongs and we can't tally up the number of times we must forgive.

Every time we sin we offend God, and He will still forgive us if we are sorry. If we want God to forgive us, then it's only fair for us to forgive others. Jesus tells us that we must forgive those people, even when they really hurt us, because we want God to forgive us too.
