

What is the Incarnation?

Some questions and answers.

4. Why did the God the Son become man?

In the Creed we profess that God the Son became man 'for us men and for our salvation'. [The Nicene Creed.]



Jesus also said, 'I have come that they may have life and have it more abundantly.' (John 10:10)

This was an act of Divine Love. Jesus explained to Nicodemus, 'God so loved the world that He gave His only Son, that whoever believes in Him may not perish but may have eternal life. (John 3:16)

He came to bring us peace, and we crucified Him. But that too was part of His plan, part of His unfathomable love for us poor sinners.

Urging us to be humble in our dealings with one another, St Paul wrote, 'Have among yourselves the same attitude

that is also yours in Christ Jesus, Who, though he was in the form of God, did not regard equality with God something to be grasped. Rather, He emptied himself, taking the form of a slave, coming in human likeness; and found human in appearance, He humbled Himself, becoming obedient to death, even death on a cross. Because of this, God greatly exalted Him and bestowed on Him the name that is above every name, that at the name of Jesus every knee should bend, of those in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father'. (Philippians 2:5-11)

5. When did the Incarnation begin?

God became man, St Paul tells us, 'in the fullness of time' (Gal 4:4-5) It was a time when the Jewish nation into which the Saviour would be born had been prepared for about 1200 years and while they were far from perfect, there were some who, faithful to the prophets and the commandments of God, were humble and faithful and waiting for the Messiah, the Saviour.

THE PRAYER OF THE FAITHFUL

In the next part of the liturgy, where the Liturgy of the Eucharist begins, gifts of bread and wine ... will be ... brought forward in procession to the priest. ... considering the prayers of the faithful as a hinge, we can say that all that we pray for now will be brought forward with the bread and wine and placed in Christ's hands for transformation. The Church

brings both herself and the world forward and petitions transformation.

So the second part of the Mass is called as a whole the Liturgy of the Eucharist. ... there are three parts the preparation of the altar and the gifts, the eucharistic prayer, and the communion rite. (p.60)

In today's Gospel reading we see that Our Lord went to Simon and Andrew's house. Simon's mother -in -law wasn't feeling well so Jesus healed her! He spent the rest of the evening healing the other sick people in the area. In the Bible, many times we see Jesus healing people. He took care of many who were sick, just like the story in our Gospel today. He also helped people who couldn't walk, or couldn't see. Jesus did amazing miracles during His time on Earth, and He helped people who needed Him.

The next morning, He woke up before the sun came up to go to a secluded place away from the house so he could pray. At first we would wonder why Jesus would have to pray- He is God after all! But he was also human so He needed to take some time to be with His Heavenly Father. That is what real praying is-it's being with God and talking to Him and listening to Him. Like Jesus, we also need to spend time with God. Even if we are always doing His work, like helping people or studying his teachings, we still need to take some time to talk with Our Father in Heaven. Starting today, let us take a few minutes every day to got spend time and talk with God.
