THE TRANSFIGURATION



It looks like this Gospel story is given to us today for the same reason that Jesus showed himself in this way to Peter, James and John – to encourage us in the difficulties of following Jesus: in our case the penances of Lent, and the penitential life in the church opposed to the secular world; in their case, the scandal of Jesus' arrest, trial and execution. Jesus holds out to us, as to his chosen ones, 'the pledge of future glory'. (This is a term used of the Eucharist, in a prayer of St Thomas Aquinas.)

Can we allow ourselves to be 'transfigured' by Christ? This is the reason for our Christian life. We are to be remade, reborn, to a new, eternal, spiritual life. It is brought about by Baptism received in faith. Still, it is a struggle for this real conversion to change us inwardly in our mortal lives. Our thinking,

our desires, must be trained in this new life.

The seasons of the Church help us to understand this life journey as a journey with Christ. The celebration of the Sacraments give us an experience of God working in us as we receive them. The practices like Lenten penance, Friday abstinence, giving Sunday and holy days to worship of God instead of mundane activity, all help form us in Christian life. Ethical norms show us the way to restrain ourselves from wrongdoing and motivate us to seek the good.

Can the church be transfigured too? In the Lenten reflection booklet we read, 'Pope Francis, echoing the Second Vatican Council, identifies the church as "first and foremost a people advancing on its pilgrim way towards God." Authentic pilgrimage requires all elements of the church to be open "to a constant self-renewal born of fidelity to Jesus Christ". The Holy Spirit is the agent of this renewal. It is the Spirit who initiates and sustains the ongoing conversion of individuals, communities, and structures in the church for the sake of the church's discipleship. ('Drawn into the Joy of the Gospel, Formation in the Archdiocese of Adelaide', quoting from Pope Francis, 'Evangelii Gaudium'.)

Some clarification about 'Volunteering as Almsgiving': What we are hoping for are new volunteers. It is pleasing that existing volunteers have shown that they are ready to continue. The table of opportunities has been updated: Some important areas were left off, due to technical troubles. They are: Children's Liturgy, held at 10 am Mass at Rosary during the school term; and Sacramental preparation for children not at Catholic schools, held at 9 am on Sunday morning in Rosary Hall during school term. Some items have been removed as no longer necessary, or as not appropriate for volunteering.



BRINGING THE GIFTS TO THE BISHOP OR PRIEST

The procession with the gifts offers us one of the strongest opportunities for understanding the relation between the sacrifice of the Christian people and the sacrifice of Christ.

Gifts of bread and wine are brought to the altar. It is an action worth examining as if under a microscope... Bread and wine and

various vessels and water and perhaps other gifts, including money, are carried by some of the baptised and brought to the bishop and/or deacon who places the bread and wine on the altar and prepares them.


Yet to understand the significance of the bread and wine we must look further and leave the church building to discover where this bread and wine have come from. It is worth tracing them all the way back to their literal, earthly roots. (pp. 62-3)
