PALM SUNDAY OF THE PASSION



We see images of the cross everywhere, from school uniforms to hospital buildings. Perhaps it is so commonplace that it doesn't stop us in our tracks the way it should. The cross of Jesus is the best key we have for understanding the mystery of God's love. God's compassion for the human family took Jesus to a lonely and brutal execution. Jesus was the victim of appalling injustice and degradation. His experience asks us to try to make

the world more just and to revere the dignity of every person. 'Whatsoever you do to the least of my sisters and brothers, you do to me.' This is part of the reason why Project Compassion has, for 60 years, been part of our Lenten observance.

This year, Holy Week begins with the reading of the passion story from Mark's Gospel. Even in busy lives, we should try to set time aside to spend with this extraordinary story, not to rush it. Gently take a little at a time and ask for the grace to be close to Jesus.

This Sunday begins Holy Week. It is the greatest week of the year.

On **Monday** at the Cathedral the priests will offer Mass with the Archbishop, renewing their commitment to the priestly ministry. The Archbishop will bless and consecrate the Holy Oils for use in the sacraments during the year. A parishioner will attend and collect the oils for use in our parish.

On **Holy Thursday** we will celebrate the Mass of the Lord's Supper, in which we celebrate the institution of the Sacrament of the Eucharist, with the story of Jesus washing the disciples' feet, as a sign of the self-sacrifice of the cross.

On **Good Friday** we will commemorate the suffering of Jesus by praying the Way of the Cross in the morning and celebrating at 3 pm the liturgy of the Commemoration of the Passion. It is a day of abstinence from meat, and fast from food. (Not totally, just less then usual!) We do this as a token of sharing in Jesus' suffering.

There is a special collection at the liturgy, for the upkeep of the shrines of the Holy Land and for the pastoral care of Christians there.

On **Holy Saturday** night the Easter Vigil will be celebrated, with a liturgy of light, an extended Liturgy of the Word, a Baptismal liturgy with water, and the Eucharist of the Resurrection.

Sunday morning is the original Sunday, the day of Resurrection, the reason why Sunday is our holy day every week. We take time to celebrate the fruits of our redemption in the Eucharist. We recall that we rely on the providence of God for all good things, without our earning them.

During 10 am Mass, we will have the joy of Baptising three students of St Dominic's Priory College.



On Palm Sunday we remember Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem. How would you think such an important person came into the town? Limo? Fancy carriage? No,

He came on a donkey! This showed that He was coming humbly and in peace. Also, by coming on a donkey, Jesus was doing something that a prophet had predicted long before He was even born. That showed God was following through on His big plans. Now, while Jesus was coming into Jerusalem, people lined up to welcome Him. They put their coats on the ground, sort of like a fancy red carpet, but also to show that the people respected Jesus and considered Him their king. They waved palm branches, which were a sign of respect, and were also a sign of victory. They shouted "Hosanna!" which means "save us."




