St Laurence's Priory Fr Peter Toan Nguyen

OP (Prior) Br Frank McKinnon OP Fr Kieran Adams OP Fr Ben Hensley OP Fr Mannes Tellis OP As you may know there is a lovely little vineyard on 134 Buxton St next door to the Priory. It has gone through its ups and downs, once Blackfriars' School tended it but now it is looked after by a number of wine enthusiasts and we thank them for the care they take with this rather quirky patch. These enthusiasts put a lot of effort into tending the vines, putting nets over them to protect the fruit and no doubt they do one thousand other things so as to bring about the best vintage they can.

The Living Vine

God is very much like these enthusiasts, he likes a good vintage, and that vintage is us. Each of us is a potential Grange Hermitage!

In the course of the spiritual life then the importance of being the best version of ourselves is the key objective. The spiritual equivalent of being a Grange Hermitage is being a saint. Much like the vine though holiness of life is not something that just happens but something that evolves and indeed is dependent on our reliance on God's grace.

Jesus evokes another image of the Father, that of the vinedresser. Much like our Buxton St enthusiasts, God the Father tends us, giving us the wherewithal to succeed as saints, and this is through a remarkable thing called grace.

The thing about grace is that it builds on and transforms our raw human nature. Alone, St Thomas remarks in his Summa Theologiae, the human person can only gain some rudimentary knowledge of his purpose and only superficially do good things, but to come to a deeper understanding of the things of God a superadded light is needed, something that goes over and beyond or above our nature, and this is called grace (cf Summa Theologiae I-II, q.109, a.2).

Interestingly though in order to be ready for God's grace there must be a pruning of sorts. Jesus intimates that "every branch that bears no fruit God cuts away, and every branch that does bear fruit God prunes to make it bear even more"(Jn 15:2-3). The pruning in our lives needs to be the casting out of sin and selfishness. So, how do we start back on the road to holiness is to begin by pruning the evil from our lives, this can be done for instance by a good, thorough confession. Like the enthusiasts who ready the soil and fertilise it so by a good confession and the pruning of sin from our lives we too can also ready the soil for the fertilisation of grace. Yet, we must be cautious here. We do not do the preparation for any of this on our own, even before we reach out for God's grace he already bestows us with the first inklings of his assistance. This activity of God is done so that we do not fall into pride, thinking we save ourselves or that there is some formula we need to follow in isolation from God. Fundamentally it is a partnership, though an unequal one. The mystery of how God's first grace that he bestows on us, yet without adulterating our free will, is a conundrum that dates back centuries and indeed it was on this point, more or less, that the Dominicans and the Jesuits locked theological horns.

Suffice it to say the importance of God's transformative grace cannot be understated. God's grace is necessary for us to achieve that by which human nature unaided could not achieve, namely beatitude, seeing God face to face without any medium as St John taught us in last week's second reading:

Beloved, we are sons of God even now, and what we shall be hereafter, has not been made known as yet. But we know that when he comes we shall be like him; we shall see him, then, as he is. (1 Jn 3:2)

This is the aim of being a part of the vine-to see God as he is, with Christ Jesus the true vine who gives his grace to assist us in this endeavour. Another principle then of our spiritual life is to keep close to Jesus despite the pruning that sometimes comes from without. Our Lord quite categorically tells us that trying to achieve heaven is fruitless without him:

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⁵ I am the vine, you are its branches; if a man lives on in me, and I in him, then he will yield abundant fruit; separated from me, you have no power to do anything. 6 If a man does not live on in me, he can only be like the branch that is cast off and withers away; such a branch is picked up and thrown into the fire, to burn there.

Let yourself be pruned so as to enable God's grace to thrive and do this within the source of that grace, the true vine, Christ Our Lord.


Jesus is the True Vine

In today's Gospel Jesus told His disciples a story to help them understand why it's important to stay connected to Him. He uses the example of a vine. A vine is a plant with a lot of branches growing out from it. The branches have fruit on them. What happens to a branch that's been broken off of a tree or a vine? It withers

up and dies. It can't ever have fruit on it again; it's not good for anything except firewood. Jesus said, "I am the vine and you are the branches. If you remain in me, you will have much fruit, but apart from me, you can do nothing." Jesus wants us to produce fruit. Good fruit, like kindness,

generosity, and faithfulness. Most of all, He wants us to love others as He has loved us.

But we can't do it on our own. Just as the branches must be connected to the vine before they can produce fruit, you and I must stay connected to Jesus to produce the good fruit that God expects of us.
